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MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Our Dear Friends

Kuwait Association for the Care of Children in Hospital (KACCH) was founded in 1989 with the mission of supporting children and families through their hospital experiences so as to minimize the adverse effects of hospitalization. In that same year the United Nations held a convention on the Rights of the Child which declared in its Charter, Article 24 :

“Parties recognise the right of the child to the enjoyment of the highest attainable standard of health and to facilities for the treatment of illness and rehabilitation of health. Parties shall strive to ensure that no child is deprived of his or her right to access such health care services.”



As a signatory to the UN Charter, Kuwait took their commitment seriously and consequently developed paediatric services in Kuwait that were second to none in the region. However, based on our own personal experience when our youngest son was hospitalized at the Amiri Hospital in 1988, and in spite of the excellent medical care he received, we felt that there was something missing. We were later to learn that that something was psychosocial support.

With the approval of the Head of Paediatrics and the Minister of Health a group of volunteers came together to learn how being admitted to hospital could adversely affect children and their families, and how these volunteers could help the children manage their journeys. They came to learn that children in hospital should not be deprived of the opportunity to play and socialise with other children in the hospital, nor should they be deprived of the comforting presence of their mothers. They found that children and their families coped better when they understood why they were in hospital and what their treatment would be like, and the families felt better when doctors talked to them and included them in decision making. Children too could understand these issues when they were presented through the medium of play, a language common to all children of all ages. Thus psychosocial support was introduced to government hospitals across Kuwait and KACCH was born.

Pioneering International leaders in Child Life from the UK and USA were invited to Kuwait to teach, train and educate KACCH Play Leaders, and later Child Life Specialists, who were then able to evaluate the special needs of children in our hospitals. In the thirty years since we began this journey KACCH has supported tens of thousands of children and families, starting with just one KACCH Playroom at the Amiri Hospital in 1989 to now seven KACCH Child Life Programmes in seven government hospitals this year.

Through the early work of the Child Life Specialists in a number of hospitals across Kuwait KACCH discovered that many children who were born with or who developed conditions that threatened or shortened their lives did not receive the “highest attainable standard of health and facilities for the treatment of illness”. And so once again KACCH found itself at the forefront of developments in paediatrics by introducing what was then a new specialty of paediatric palliative care to support these children and their families.

To raise awareness of the need for such care KACCH organised the first Middle East International Conference on Paediatric Palliative Care in 2005. Sponsored by The Ministry of Health, Faculty of Medicine and KFAS as well as many other organisations and businesses and pro-bono contributions, this conference brought the top ten paediatric palliative care experts in the world to Kuwait and resulted in the whole community of Kuwait supporting the development of Bayt Abdullah Children’s Hospice, (BACCH) which stands legally and operationally under the umbrella of KACCH.

For the last ten years KACCH and BACCH have grown alongside each other, registered with the Ministry of Social Affairs, regulated by the Ministry of Health and governed by the same Board of Directors. As both arms of the organisation have matured under the leadership of the CEO in BACCH and the Deputy Director of KACCH, and the fact that many functions such as HR, Finance and IT, and services such as psychosocial support, research and volunteering are common to both arms, the Board made the decision recently to amalgamate the two arms. Following lengthy discussions with top management and all staff it was agreed that in order to optimize our resources, streamline our operations, cut costs and maximise our children and families’ experiences we would merge the above functions and services over a two year period.

With our team of Paediatric Palliative Care Specialists, paediatricians, therapists and other allied health professionals delivering individualised paediatric palliative care to children who are not expected to survive childhood, many of whom have some of the rarest known conditions, and with qualified experienced Child Life Specialists and Play Leaders providing psychosocial support to thousands of children in hospitals across Kuwait, we believe that the services provided by an amalgamated KACCH and BACCH will go a long way to supporting the Ministry of Health’s commitment to ensure no child in Kuwait is deprived of his or her right to the highest attainable standard of health care.

What better way to end the decade than to celebrate the 30th Anniversary of the Founding of KACCH. True to our tradition, a wonderful Carnival, sponsored by NBK brought 100 school children from the British School of Kuwait (BSK) and The English School (TES) who lined the Magic Carpet in Bayt Abdullah to sing our songs “We are the World” and “Children of the World” followed by the beautiful voice of our Music Therapist singing solo with only a guitar accompaniment “Somewhere over the Rainbow. Surrounded by over 400 children and their families, plus KACCH and BACCH staff and families, Board and Executive Committee Members and Volunteers all mingling together as children played games, munched pizza and parents chatted, it was a truly emotional and memorable experience. With a final flourish, children painted a mural on the wall outside the KACCH office as a lasting testament to the resilience, creativity and love of life our children have, and the dedication of our staff, volunteers, sponsors, donors and supporters. The title of the mural is “We are the Children”.

Thank you all, and may the next thirty years be blessed by your continued efforts and support for all our children.

KACCH MISSION

Our Mission

Kuwait Association for the Care of Children in Hospital (KACCH) advocates for the provision of optimal conditions for children and their families in hospital, in order to reduce the adverse effects of hospitalisation on their development and wellbeing.

Our Philosophy

We believe in upholding the rights of the child as declared in the UN charter of 1989, to which Kuwait is a signatory that states that it is the right of every child to receive expert health care delivered, whenever possible, by paediatric trained physicians and nurses, within family-centred, child-friendly facilities. We also support the recent declaration of the WHO which states that palliative care is a basic human right for all children with life-limiting and life-threatening conditions, and the Rome Charter of 2016 which confirms the above rights and which is additionally supported by signatories representing the major religions of the world, including Islam.

Our Objectives

- To minimise the stressful impact of hospitalisation and illness on the child and family in hospital.
- To facilitate optimal growth and development of the child.
- To prepare children and families for their health care experiences.
- To communicate effectively with other members of the health care team.
- To ensure the continuity and development of the Child Life programme within health care settings in Kuwait.
- To share expertise and co-operate with international and regional organisations.
- To recognise when hospital is not the optimum health care setting for the child and to advocate for the provision of paediatric palliative care at home, in a hospital, or in a children's hospice, so that parents can choose how and where their child with life-limiting or life-threatening conditions is treated.

THE VALUE OF PLAY





“When we make play the foundation of learning, we teach the whole child.”

Hospitalisation and healthcare experiences can be very stressful and traumatizing for children and their families. Play in the hospital creates a space of continuity of everyday life for a child. By providing and facilitating play opportunities, children are able to express themselves, cope with their anxiety, stress, and fear, process their health care experience in a safe and non-threatening environment, create, achieve, and continue to learn and develop.

More importantly, play enables and empowers a child to make choices as to feel that they maintain control.

At KACCH, play is the foundation of the support provided to children and their families in the hospitals. Provided below are examples of the different types of play.

Developmentally Supportive Play

Developmentally supportive play promotes normal life experiences to support growth and development.



Medical Play

Medical play is play with a medical theme that reflects a child's own real life experience. It uses real or toy medical equipment, and often dolls or teddy bears. These items help children become more familiar with medical procedures, equipment, and the healthcare environment in a way that won't scare them.

Distraction through Play

Distraction through play gives a child something to focus on and is especially effective to minimize anxiety. An age appropriate individualised distraction plan is developed for each child to create a positive experience for the child during a medical procedure.

KACCH CHILD LIFE PROGRAMME'S COMMITMENT TO PLAY



CHILD LIFE SPECIALISTS

The KACCH Child Life Programmes in Kuwait's hospitals are led by Child Life Specialists (CLS) who are supported by trained and supervised Play Leaders.

The Child Life Specialist uses play, the universal language of children, to help them express their emotions, understand their illnesses and treatments and learn coping strategies to deal with unknown and sometimes frightening healthcare experiences in the hospital.

They advocate for patient and family centred care by raising awareness of the psychosocial needs of the children and their families to other members of the paediatric medical team.

KACCH Child Life Specialists offer a variety of services that include:

- Promoting normal growth and development through play.
- Preparing children for medical procedures through the use of images, real medical equipment, and developmentally appropriate language.
- Providing psychosocial support during medical procedures by helping children develop coping strategies.
- Facilitating therapeutic play, art, and self-expression experiences.
- Supporting children and their families in understanding their illness and hospitalization.
- Advocating for children and their families as they navigate the healthcare environment.
- Encouraging non-pharmacological pain strategies (cognitive and behavioural strategies) to support reducing pain for children.
- Promoting patient and family centred care.
- Providing sibling support.
- Providing grief and bereavement support to patients and their families when needed.





PLAY LEADERS

KACCH Play Leaders are professionals who work with the Child Life Specialist to promote and facilitate developmentally appropriate play for children in the hospital. Therapeutic play services are provided in the KACCH Playroom, outpatient clinics, waiting rooms and at bedside.

KACCH Play Leaders offer a variety of services that include:

- Helping children cope with being in the hospital through “normal play experiences” (typical play children engage in everyday).
- Organising daily play and art experiences in the hospital playroom, child’s bedside, or hospital clinics.
- Facilitating quality developmental play.
- Supporting the implementation of special events to maintain each child’s connection with home, school, and the community.




AL AMIRI HOSPITAL



Child Life Specialist Interventions






NBK CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL



Child Life Specialist Interventions







AL JAHRA HOSPITAL




Child Life Specialist Interventions




AL FARWANIYA HOSPITAL



Child Life Specialist Interventions

















BAYT ABDULLAH CHILDREN'S HOSPICE

This year we have expanded our day care sessions to include drop ins – where families can just walk into day care for play, afternoon and weekend hours which was positively welcomed by families. As this responds to their individual needs and their schedules of managing their children's time with school and activities. Giving us a marked increase in children and family visits. In addition to continuing to add to our referral stream from various disease groups by having families self-refer.

November 2019, saw the wonderful celebration of KACCH's 30th year anniversary, this was held at Bayt Abdullah by utilizing multiple external and indoor areas allowing children and families to enjoy a full programme of play, activities and refreshments.

December 2019 saw the rejoining of Dr Emma Al-Khabbaz after the completion of her two year Paediatric Palliative Fellowship at Great Ormond Street Hospital (GOSH) through the sponsorship of The Kuwait Institute for Medical Specializations (KIMS).

To illustrate the impact of our services on children and families, we would like to present a case study of one of our children from our caseload. This as always cannot be achieved without the partnership with our families to help improve their quality of life and support them through their journey.



Hiba's Story:

(Name of the child has been changed to provide anonymity but consent has been gained from parent to share their story).

Hiba is an -11 year-old girl with a very rare condition called Moyamoya disease. This condition consists of repeated cerebral (brain) strokes. As a consequence of the strokes she now has generalized spasticity, blindness and disturbed consciousness. When Hiba was referred to BACCH she was in a vegetative state and had been in hospital for many months. Hiba has a very supportive loving family consisting of mum, dad and 2 siblings but they were terrified of bringing her home due to not understanding her condition and not having the skillset to properly care for her.

How did BACCH support this family?

BACCH commenced a multidisciplinary palliative care plan whilst she was in hospital to plan her discharge to home. This was completed in conjunction with her family and the primary hospital team, BACCH doctors, nurses, physiotherapist and dietician. A detailed Symptom Management Plan was completed in addition to discussing an Advanced Care Plan with the family. This was important as it was also an opportunity for parents to ask questions about their fears and what should they do in an emergency situation.

BACCH supplied all the required medications and consumables and our nurses completed a home risk assessment prior to her discharge which highlighted any concerns or equipment needs within the home environment. Discharge from hospital was planned successfully and Hiba arrived home with the support of a BACCH doctor and nurse who met her on arrival. We continued to support the family at home with daily home visits by a nurse and/or doctor for the first two weeks until the family was comfortable with Hiba's care.

All her services continued at home such as Music Therapy; initially, there was minimal response, but Hiba gradually began to improve in her ability to interact and respond to her environment. Through music therapy, the family have become more involved in Hiba's care. They engage in music therapy together. Music therapy has given the siblings a place where they are able to share their day, their favourite songs and create happy memories and communicate with their sister.

Additionally, the BACCH Physiotherapist identified some key areas to work on in conjunction with Hiba's family to support her care and daily routines. She can now have her nappy changed without any pain or discomfort. She can now tolerate some movement and sit up for a few hours a day to better interact with her family members.

In October of 2019, the parents were able to spend a week on holiday abroad with Hiba's siblings, safe in the knowledge that Hiba was enjoying a respite holiday of her own, being cared for by the BACCH team in Bayt Abdullah Children's Hospice.

All of the family have expressed their thanks and below is part of an email sent to BACCH:

"I just want to thank you and all the staff working in BACCH for taking care of H--- during my travel to Egypt. BACCH is not just a palliative care center, no it is part of God's heaven placed on earth and all the workers are the angels who Sent by God to help and support us. Everyone in BACCH is doing his best to help us to overcome our sadness troubles with our kids. And really they all did their work with love. The best thing in BACCH is the lovely smile that I always see on all the staff face. Thank you all for your efforts and your support for us and for our kids. And Thanks God for having a place like BACCH in Kuwait which I think it is the best palliative center in Middle East."

Without the support and generosity of our donors and supporters we could not have supported Hiba and her family and other children and families like her.

I would like to thank and extend our sincerest appreciation, to those donors who have supported us with their donations, resources and time; we could not have achieved our objectives to support those children and families in need. Thank you too, to the many sponsors who have supported us throughout 2019 by funding wonderful activities at Bayt Abdullah on a regular basis. This collaboration is what our families see as the community's willing engagement to be a part of the life of our children and families. Every moment is precious, and with your support, we can make sure that we give our children and their families the best quality of life possible.



BACCH Operational data for 2019






From January 2019 to December 2019, we have had **50 patients** on our case load offering our services to **218 family members** (parents and siblings) and **supporting 119 siblings**.




Association for Children's Palliative Care (ACT) Categories of Life Limiting and Life Threatening Conditions

- Category 3 Progressive conditions without curative treatment options.
- Category 4 Irreversible but non-progressive conditions causing sever disability, leading to susceptibility to health complications and likelihood of premature death.
